This virtual workshop on zoom focuses on the power of conversations about antiracism between participants of varying generations as well as other identities. We encourage but don't require each guest to invite a grandchild, parent, grandparent, niece, cousin, neighbor, friend, or anyone you're well acquainted with from another generation to join you for this virtual event. Ideally guests who attend the event can follow up with one another after the event to keep the conversation going.

We need 5 voluntary pairs of participants to have a discussion live on screen in brief conversation with one another. Each pair will respond to a sample question, video clip, image, or quote.
